






Children and young people lead radical reform of care services in Wales

A declaration committing to the radical reform of care services for children and young people has been signed by the First Minister Mark Drakeford today.



The declaration, developed jointly by care-experienced children and young people and ministers, outlines the Welsh Government's commitment to putting the voice of children and young people at the heart of the transformation of children's services.

It commits the Welsh Government to deliver a wide range of changes to the current care system, to enable a 'children first' approach in everything we do and to make sure that everything is done to help children and families stay together.

The declaration comes as the Welsh Government is radically transforming children's services in Wales.

It is committed to reducing the number of children and young people entering care but for those children who are in care, it wants them to remain close to home so they can continue to be part of their community.



Lessons learned

- > Care experienced young people can be amazing leaders
- > Create groups and get to know each other spend time and do activities
- ➤ Get to know adult allies politicians and public
- ➤ Be creative DJ workshops and Badger Puppet
- Develop your strengths get informed, share information
- > Build partnerships with other organisations including academics
- Make links to the political processes that already exist voting, youth councils, national and international platforms
- > Remind people of their duties and your rights
- > Try to influence laws, guidance and how people do things in practice locally, nationally and internationally
- > Remember we can do this together and there are lots of us working for similar change
